

began playing the piano at the age of 4 and began formal training in piano at the age of 5; by the age of 8, he was skill-

fully playing classical compositions by Beethoven. He studied piano and theory at the Cleveland Music School Settlement and later at the Cleveland Institute of Music. While still a junior in high school, he was awarded a scholarship to Durham College in North Carolina, where he studied percussion and composition and was a student in the Eastern Music Festival Youth Orchestra in which he skillfully played the timpani. At the age of 16, he began recording and by the age of 21, he had performed on six albums. Drene Ivy served as musician for many years at his home church, Pentecostal Church of Christ, where his gifted musical skills were honed. He was inspired by his pastor, the late Bishop Charles Watkins, to pursue his talent in the contemporary music realm.

Drene Ivy was instructor of jazz composition and techniques, piano, and theory for the Houston Board of Education as well as instructor of Jazz History at Cleveland State University. Drene Ivy has composed over 150 songs. His compositions are comprised of a wide range of genres, including inspirational, gospel, classical, easy listening, jazz, and Latin jazz. His contemporary gospel composition entitled *Standing In The Need Of Prayer*, was reviewed and presented at the National Baptist Convention. In 2002, he was featured artist in concert at Zion First C.O.G.I.C. in Oakland, CA by Watkins Memorial Institutional Church C.O.G.I.C., International, and most recently was Musical Director for a local recording artist at Playhouse Square's Ohio Theater in Cleveland.

In 2004, Drene Ivy was guest clinician at the famed Edwin Hawkins and Walter Hawkins Music and Arts Love Fellowship Conference. In June 2005, he served as staff clinician, teaching keyboard performance. In August 2005, his song composition, *Worship The King*, was selected and presented at the *Gospel Music Workshop of America Convention* in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He just completed an 8-year position as Minister of Music at Mt. Zion Fellowship in Highland Hills, Ohio and currently serves as Minister of Music at his church in East Cleveland, Ohio. Drene Ivy has released his third CD, *With These Hands*, and will re-release his Christmas CD, *We Reverence Your Name*.

Dr. Cheston studied Suzuki theory curriculum and pedagogy at the Cleveland Institute of Music, with Jennifer Conner, and Suzuki piano teacher training at the Cleveland Institute of Music with Katherine Barley. She studied piano with James Tannenbaum and Robert Mayerovitch; piano pedagogy with Evelyn Gott; theory with Alvaretta West and James Feldman; and ethnomusicology with T. Temple Tuttle. She lectures and performs throughout the United States on the topic of Afro-American Gospel Music Piano Accompaniment Performance Practices, music in worship, and other topics.

As Artist-in-Residence at the Cleveland School of the Arts, she composed music scores for mainstage productions performed in the *Playhouse Square Entertainment Center*, including *Chicken Little*, which received the *Cleveland Critic's Circle Carolyn Reid Award for Educational Theater* and *The Northern Ohio Live Magazine Award of Achievement in Theater*. Her commissioned piece, *Freedom Medley*, was premiered at the 2002 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration in Oberlin, Ohio. Also, she served as Assistant Chorus Master for the Ohio premiere of Dr. Leslie Adams' *The Righteous Man* with the *Ohio Chamber Orchestra*, under the direction of Dwight Oltman.

As choral conductor, pianist, and music educator, Dr. Cheston has held numerous positions in universities, public schools, and churches throughout northeast Ohio, and has served as adjudicator and guest conductor at choral festivals and contests.

Currently, Dr. Cheston serves on the faculty of the Cleveland Institute of Music, Preparatory Division. Also, she is owner of *Tiamoyo Arts and Education*, a multidimensional company that provides inspirational and educational products for children and adults through the use of the musical arts and various educational methods, including live performances, workshops, presentations and a variety of published materials (printed music, books, and music CDs). In addition, she serves as Worship Director at her church and teaches Suzuki piano and theory at her busy studio, Tiamoyo Music Academy, in Woodmere, Ohio, where she lives with her husband and their three children.
